AENON SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY 2008 FALL SEMESTER COURSE OFFERING



MONDAY 6:00-8:45 P.M.

MIN 400 **MINISTERIAL INTRODUCTION**
(3 units) **Eld. Levon Mitchell**

This course requires pastoral approval and is designated for those going into the ministry. An overview of pastoral skills will be studied in this three-month course and disciplines of the ministry.

CED 119 **POWERFUL ACTS OF PRAYER**
(3 units) **Dr. Genevieve Shepherd**

This course will examine types of prayers based on the scriptures and how God's power is released through prayer.

CED 122 **PUBLIC SPEAKING**
(3 units) **Marcele Haymond**

Instruction in the preparation, organization, and deliverance of the basic types of speeches. This introductory course is designed to develop individual speaking skills.

BIB 417 **EXEGESIS**
(3 units) **Eld. Duane Odom**

This course offers a closer examination of scriptural text on the basis of the text itself. It teaches how to draw the meaning out of a given text.

BIB 416 **DANIEL & REVELATION**
(3 units) **Eld. Adrian Haymond**

This course is a diligent inquiry into the circumstances of divinely appointed world empires and a practical look at the end times. Particular interest is paid to the dovetailing of these two books.

CED 226-B **GOD'S HIGH CALLING FOR MEN**
(3 units) **Eld. Gary Thomas**

This course explores the Biblical basis for the involvement of men in the church, the family and the society. It examines the role of men from Bible times to present.

TUESDAY 6:00-8:45 P.M.

MAT 182 **BASIC MATHEMATICS**
(3 units) **Eld. Allen Mitchell**

A study of basic math principles and practices.

MIN 123 **PRINCIPLES OF WORSHIP**
(3 units) **Evang. Michelle King**

This course explores a deeper understanding of worshipping God in "Spirit and in Truth" (John 4:23-24). It is designed to help the student understand the true meaning of pure worship fostering a renewed desire and longing to enter into the "Presence of the Lord."

BIB 115 **LIFE OF CHRIST I**
(3 units) **Min. Peter Nagy**

This course provides a probe into the identity, works and teachings of Jesus Christ. Understanding is drawn from observation of the record left by the gospel writers.

MIS 263 **PERSONAL EVANGELISM**
(3 units) **Min. Eric Gibson**

This course examines methods of effective witnessing and personal roles in ministry. It provides students with practical experiences in soul winning.

ENG 101 **ENGLISH GRAMMAR I**
(3 units) **Monica Messenger**

This introductory course is a study of the elements of functional English, grammar, sentence structure and paragraph construction.

M 172 **COMPUTER LITERACY**
(3 units) **Min. Tony Baskerville**

This is a hands on laboratory course providing foundational understanding of computers and how to efficiently utilize them.

PSY 255 **COUNSELING IN ABUSIVE SITUATIONS**

(3 units) **Min. Martin Jones**
This course examines major phases of human abuse: i.e., mental, physical, sexual, and substance abuse. Current theories and accepted procedures of counseling are discussed.

TUESDAY 7:30-9:30 P.M.

THE 160 **APOSTOLICITY**
(3 units) **Dr. Howard Swancy, D. D.**

This course examines the Apostolic doctrine - its biblical beginning, tenants, and foundation.

THURSDAY 6:00-8:45 P.M.

BIB 111 **NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY**
(3 units) **Evang. Beatrice Guillory**

A review of each book of the New Testament surmising its purpose, theme, author and date written.

HIS 131 **HISTORY OF PENTECOST**
(3 units) **Eld. Allen Mitchell**

A short history is given of the Pentecostal Church from the Apostolic to the modern era. The history of Pentecostal organizations and the lives of Pentecostal stalwarts are reviewed.

BIB 110 **OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY**
(3 units) **Dean Mary Jordan**

Books of the Old Testament canon are surveyed with special interest in the history of their time; i.e., message, date, audience, theme and purpose.

SATURDAY 10:30 A.M.-1:00 P.M.

CED 230 **SPIRITUAL GROWTH & MATURITY**
(3 units) **Eld. Orlando Love**

This course teaches the student self-examination fundamental to growth, development and maturity in Christianity.
